



# **Patriots Memorial Park**

Patriots' Memorial Park was designed by Olmsted Brothers Landscape Architects in 1922. In the process of researching for its application for the National Register of Historic Places in the early 1990s, it was discovered that the Park was actually part of a planned residential development called Tavern Acres. The application to the NRHP was approved and included the park, twenty surrounding houses, and Stevens Memorial Library. New plans were drawn to use available plants but funds were also raised and trees and shrubs were planted and paths installed. Monuments from World War II and the Korean-Vietnam conflicts were moved to the park which already contained an impressive monument to the citizens of North Andover who served in WWI, and all monuments were cleaned and restored. The Friends of Patriots Memorial Park continues to maintain the Park, much to the enjoyment of the citizens of the town, and each year hosts a spring as well as fall clean-up.
